



From the Chairman ...

Greenhill Library is a wonderful community initiative. It is difficult to believe that 2 years ago we were only a campaigning group. 18 months ago there were 15 of us on a Steering group planning to take over the running of the Library. Our vision was *"To provide a vibrant, welcoming and inclusive Library as a focal point that would meet the many needs of our community."*



What have we achieved during these last 18 months? We have Recruited and trained 150 volunteers to work in various areas of the Library. Chatterbooks, Storytime and Funtime have all grown, 150 took up the Summer Reading Challenge and local schools and uniformed organisations visit the library. The building itself looks much better and plans are in place for further improvements. However, all the Associate Libraries are still negotiating their Lease. In January 16 we added 600 'new' books to borrow from Greenhill. It would be great if more people could be involved. Please become a Friend of Greenhill Library by donating a small amount each year or offering your time as a volunteer.

Chatterbooks is a nationally recognised book club for children aged between 8 and 12. We re-launched Chatterbooks at the Library in September 2015. We look at general reading and non-fiction books, with a range of genres and authors to appeal to this age range.

Sessions are limited to 10 children, so we can focus on everyone and allow all the children to participate. We encourage children to read books (printed or electronic), talk about them, and engage with words. It is the perfect place to meet people who love reading and to make friends, build confidence and develop communication and social skills.

Since starting our sessions, we have had a lot of interest from people wanting to know more. 


